








Phase 1 Deployment – Total Homes Passed









Overview

- Implementing ultrafast FTTP technology to 4545 premises
- Every premise passed gains the same service
- Significant public investment (£2m) and Gigaclear investment of £5.5m



What can FTTP do for me?







Pure Fibre Broadband - speeds are unaffected by distance or weather conditions

Basic Broadband Scheme



- Formerly known as UK Government Satellite Broadband Scheme
- Now called Basic Broadband Scheme ('Better Broadband Scheme' by BDUK)
- Interim solution for those currently unable to get
 2Mbps or more
- You'll pay no more than £400 in the first year
- Take-up remains slow, but changes to the scheme have been made








What is it?

- A scheme to enable local communities to provide a public Wi-Fi service via community hubs. (I.e. village halls)
- The aim is to encourage and support communities to make use of the new Next Generation Access infrastructure being installed by the Superfast Essex Programme.



 Aimed at but not limited to community hubs enabled to access superfast broadband.









How will it work?

- Community hubs will have the opportunity to buy a broadband service from up to five suppliers approved/vetted by Superfast Essex (subject to successful bids)
- Initial set up costs will be supported by the Community Initiatives Fund.
- Community hubs will then pay a monthly service charge.











When will the scheme launch?

- Superfast Essex sought interest from 100 suppliers to participate in bidding for the scheme.
- 18 suppliers confirmed their interest and were sent the request for quotation (RFQ) document compiled by Superfast Essex.
- Deadline for submissions extended.

Make the Connection Survey



We use this survey to capture demand for faster broadband across Essex. Available at www.superfastessex.org/getinvolved.

- **43%** of respondents' postcodes now have superfast broadband available
- ❖ A further 39% of respondents' postcodes are now within the Superfast Essex rollout plan
- This means by the end of our current planned rollout, 82% of respondents' demand for faster broadband will have been met







What next - 'last 5%'



Establish view of 'last 5%' and options to address

- Full, address-level map of 'market failure' areas (OMR)
- Market testing with suppliers
- Public Consultation (by October 2016)



Phase 3 planning (some 45,000 premises left)

- ECC governance
- Confirm funding
- Procurement (by May 2017)
